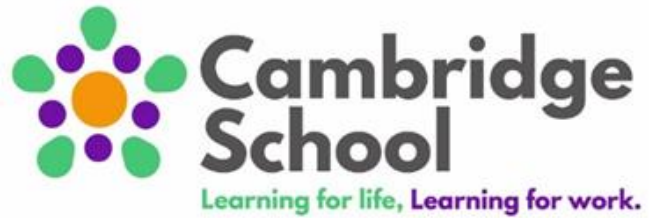


# Newsletter

Dear Parent/Carer,

As I write to you at 08:30am this morning, the temperature is already 24 degrees Celsius. Today is going to be a scorcher and whilst this is great news if you are at the beach, it is not so wonderful to be stuck in school.
