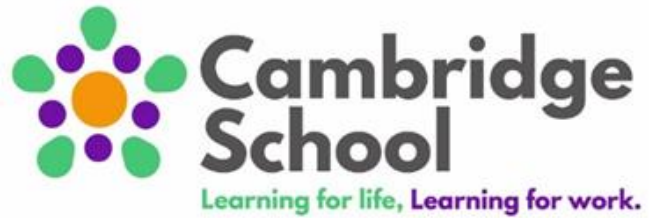


# Newsletter

Dear Parent/Carer,

This has been a miserable start to Spring with the Baltic weather conditions and relentless rain and sleet. However cold and wet it is outside, inside Cambridge School the light and heat generated by the students' learning is inspirational. On Friday 3rd March, we welcomed Trevor Davies, our external School Improvement Partner who came to scrutinise our performance in two of the Ofsted categories; Behaviour and Attitudes and Personal Development. He attended Assemblies and sat in on a lively and passionate School Council meeting where students were fizzing with ideas on how to improve the playground and how to raise money for this project. Trevor commented, "Students flourish in an environment based on caring supportive relationships and strong professional values. As a result, students achieve well and enjoy school, as do the staff". This is really pleasing to read and is reflective of the positive and collaborative ethos of the school where relationships are a major strength.

Four of our girls have embarked on a reading project at Ark Swift Primary Academy where they are modelling good reading skills to Reception and Year 1 students. I am immensely proud of the girls as they develop their confidence and voice in our male-dominated school. They have some wonderful role models as the female staff here are all Superwomen! The Cambridge males have a lot of hard work to do to match their commitment and work ethic.

The school has been plastered with posters advertising and promoting World Maths Day and all students have been engaging in activities which make Maths fun and engaging. I have been visiting Green Pod classes this week and focusing on how emotional intelligence and personal target setting can achieve a growth mind-set for our students. All Green classes were excellent, but Armstrong in particular were discussing future dreams and careers with maturity and confidence.
